An observation during Q&A sessions. Many of the people asking questions were the same across all sessions. Some of the questions were very long in duration and this prevented other peoples involvement. I also observed that some of the facilitators often adding lengthy remarks to the Q&A exacerbating this issue. Whilst I realise that not everyone feels comfortable asking questions in a group, I did feel that not everyone who wanted to speak had the chance. The structure on day 3 of writing Qs on post it's, clustering into themes and answering was a more inclusive way of getting feedback.

Just absolutely brilliant - I am so busy in work, long hours, that this was a real squeeze to attend but has really invigorated me and reduced my feelings of isolation and we genuinely felt like 1 organisation rather than many. Thank you to everyone - i have a lot of thinking and implementing to do now though based on so much inspiring sessions!!
